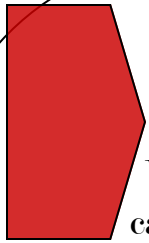

We recognize that in order to be successful in school, our children need support from both the home and school. Elementary School Afternoon Dismissal
Procedures

NECP is pleased to announce our new afternoon pick-up procedures for the Elementary grades. ***Your child's safety and the safety of our teachers is our number one concern.*** Older Elementary siblings will go with the youngest child. The afternoon dismissal in Elementary grades at 3:00 is as follows:

The **Kindergarten and 1st grade** classes housed in the Early Elementary Building (previously the K building) will dismiss with a single lane traffic flow.

Grades 1 through 6 will dismiss from the Main Elementary building with a two lane traffic pattern

For safety purposes, please adhere to the following guidelines:

Place your placard on the passenger side dash which will make it easily visible to staff.

Parents will receive a placard at the Meet and Greet specific to your child(ren) and his/her grade level.

Please remain in your car at all times.

We will load up to 12 cars in our designated loading stations (6 cars in each lane)

When all cars in the loading zone are loaded and ready for a safe exit, a stop hand signal will change to a go signal. Please **DO NOT PASS A LOADING CAR AT ANY TIME.**

This process will continue until all students are loaded.

Thank you for your cooperation and assistance with this new process. We value your patience as we work together to ensure a safe departure for all.



The Husky Club Afterschool Care Program

The Husky Club Afterschool program is an enrichment program offered to North East Carolina Prep School families. In keeping with the school's philosophy, the Husky Club strives to provide a nurturing environment and places top priority on enhancing the development of qualities such as self-esteem, self-discipline, integrity, compassion, and respect for others. The program will offer a safe and convenient atmosphere that is friendly, warm, and nurturing. A professional staff member(s) will provide quality programming while respecting the diversity of each family.

The Husky Club will begin immediately following the school day. Parents will need to pre-register their child(ren) for the afterschool program. The program may be used by NECP Children on a regular or occasional basis. If your child is not a regular attendee, please notify your child's teacher or the main office when childcare is needed. We will assist with a positive transition into the program for that day. If you are delayed in picking your child up from school, the teacher will wait with your child for the first 15 minutes. If you are later than 15 minutes, your child will be sent to the Husky Club. Parents will be charged according to the fees of the program. Care will be provided from 3:00 until 6:00. The cost for the program will be as follows:

\$6 per hour or \$75 per week with a minimum of \$3 per day *or*

3 days for \$50.00

2nd child will be an additional \$30 per week (\$105 for 2 per week)

10% off if paying a week in advance

(Payment must be received by close of business day on Friday to receive discount)
