## **End of Year Testing**

The NC Department of Public Instruction has outlined the end of the year testing with EOG/EOC's required to be given within the last 10 days of the school year.

Additionally as a public Charter School, NECP is also required to administer the North Carolina Final Exams (NCFE). These exams are subject based and are administered in 6th grade -11th grade for all core subject areas where an EOG/EOC or AP exam is not given. According to NC state guidelines, the NCFE has to be administered in the last 5 days of school and counts as 10% of the students' final grade.



### **Media Center Notes**

It's been a busy year so far in both of our media centers! Here are some facts that you may not know:

- We earned \$3000 in books and cash profit from our 1st Scholastic Book Fair this year.
- 100+ new books have been ordered or purchased, and many books have been generously donated by parents and staff.
- Our collection now contains about 6,000 copies.
- There are 30+ students trying out for our 2 Battle of the Books Teams (Elementary 4th,5th and Middle 6th-8th).
- A "Lunch Bunch" Reading Enrichment Activity has begun on Wednesdays for 3rd graders (Aso ne group finishes their book study, we'll bring in another group of students.)
- Our "Husky Star Reader" wall is filling up with 1st-6th graders' pictures. Stars will be added for each additional book read.
- I keep up with the best literature for children and young adults by reading journals, attending conferences and listening to student and faculty requests.

Please touch base with the students about what they are reading and read with them. If you model reading at home, these children will pick up on it! Ask them about their books and make sure they are reading on the right level. My favorite part of my job is matching books to children's reading levels and interests. They will tell you that I don't accept, "I don't like to read." My theory is that they haven't been connected with the right book!

Also, it's important to help your child take care of his/her library book. We have lost hundreds of books that equate to hundreds of dollars lost for our school media centers. When I ask for payment for these books, it's not a punishment but just a way to replace them. All books will need to be turned in or paid for at the end of the year for students to receive their report cards. If you need to contact me, my email is brittaince@necprepschool.com.

The best way to get kids reading more is to give them books they'll gobble up-and then ask for another. Yes, it's that simple. 1+1=2. It just does. Kids say the number one reason they don't read more is that they can't find books they like. Freedom of choice is a key to getting them motivated and excited. - James Patterson, Author
